Infrastructure Update: Monitoring of affected reservoirs and towers

There are steady improvements in the affected areas in and around the City of Johannesburg. Johannesburg Water estimates restoration of supply to the Linksfield Reservoir by evening of 12 March 2022, Alexander Park Reservoir zone by morning of 13 March 2022 and South Hills Tower by afternoon of 14 March 2022.

The flow into the Linksfield Reservoir is normal and has improved. Some areas have started receiving water.

The **Linksfield Reservoir** supplies the following areas:

Linksfield, Glenhazel, Rouxville, Highlands North, Fairmount, Fairmount ridge, Glensan, Dunhill, Hawkins Estate, Cheltondale, Sunningdale, Raumarais Park, Linksfield North, Gresswold, Forbesdale, Fellside, Fairwood, Bramley, Bramley Park, Abbotsford, Victoria, Orange Grove, Oaklands, Melrose North, Maryvale, Norwood, Sandringham, Orchards, Sydenham, Waverly, Houghton Estate, Fairvale, Savoy Estate, Kew and Raedene Estate

Alexander Park reservoir zone:

Kensington, Ben rose, Heriotdale, Denver, De Wetshof, The Gardens, Malvern, Cleveland, Elcedes, Wychwood

South Hills Tower zone:

Risana, Linmeyer, South Hills, Tulisa Park, Steeledale, The Hill, Oakdene, Rosettenville and Klipriviersberg estate.

Due to the large area affected, alternate water supply through mobile tankers and water tanks, are focused on key sites.

Johannesburg Water urges customers to reduce consumption for critical needs during this period as the systems recover.

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
