Johannesburg Water system: morning update

South Hills tower

The ongoing situation at the tower remains the same. The tower is still on bypass due to poor water supply. Consequently, the areas supplied by this tower are experiencing a critical reduction in water pressure. This unfortunate circumstance has had a significant impact on the customers within the affected supply zone, as they can anticipate encountering low water pressure to no water.

The persistently low water pressure poses numerous challenges for residents and businesses in the area, hampering their ability to perform daily tasks that require sufficient water pressure. Diligent efforts are underway to rectify this situation, and we are actively working with our supplier to restore normal water pressure levels urgently. We understand the inconvenience and frustration this has caused, and we deeply appreciate your patience and understanding as we diligently pursue a solution.

Commando System

- Crosby reservoir: remains critically low. Flows are still being redirected to support the Brixton complex. Customers may experience low pressure to no water.
- Hursthill 1 reservoir: Critically low, customers may experience low pressure to no water.
- Hursthill 2 reservoir: Critically low, customers in this supply zone should expect low water pressure. The outlet is now fully open.
- Brixton reservoir: Water levels remain low. Customers in the supply zone should anticipate low water pressure. Currently, the reservoir outlet remains throttled at 50%.
- Brixton tower: Water levels in the tower zone have improved significantly. Customers within the supply zone should now have access to a stable water supply.

Linden 1 tower

- Water levels in the tower have improved, and customers within the supply zone should now have uninterrupted access to water.

Eagles Nest reservoir

- Remains critically low due to poor supply and high demand. Customers in this supply zone should still expect low water pressure.

Doornkop reservoir
